Tasks

The four sessions that will be proposed below are thought to be carried out at the 1st level of the Baccalaureate both for the level of English required and for the complexity of the tasks that will be explained. The subject where it will take place will be in English Language, so the realization of the sessions will take place during three consecutive weeks, one session per week. The work will consist of an oral and a written part. The written part will consist of two activities in which, from a series of web pages provided, students will have to perform a writing task and a relationship of ideas. As for the oral part and to finish the work, all the students will make an oral presentation for their classmates about some aspects that will be specified later. The general objective of this work is that students acquire a detailed knowledge about the part of the British history corresponding to King Arthur known as the Arthurian cycle. The specific objectives that are proposed are: Learn to use the internet in a responsible and useful way Know how to filter irrelevant information to focus on the most important oneBe able to express ideas and thoughts on a specific topic in a fluid way with a digital support Practice the investigation to obtain the information they needRegarding the contents, it is expected that when this project is finished students must have learned: The origin of the story of King Arthur The geographical situation in which the events occurred What characters compose the story and the relationship between them How that story was created until what we know nowadaysThe timing of that story Personal reflection based on their research on whether the character of King Arthur was real or fictional. About the anbsp; methodology, the webquest is considered one of the most appropriate for this task because thanks to the reliable sources that are provided, the consolidation and the achievement of the objectives and content is something easy to achieve. In addition, the fact that it requires the use of ICT makes the interest of students increase. Furthermore, they begin to use technologies not only as an entertainment but as a source of work and information.

Process

SESSION 1Taking into account the sessionÂ's total duration of 55 minutes, it will be structured as follows: the first 20 minutes will be devoted to explaining the project to the students and presenting the webquest and the way of use; 30 minutes will be used to complete the activities that will be specified below from the web pages that will be provided; the leftover 5 minutes will be used to turn on and off the electronic equipment as well as to resolve possible doubts. Explain briefly how the legend of the Arthurian cycle has been forming throughout the ages and the different authors4. Temporalization of the Arthurian cycle with its main facts and a brief summary of them.5. The written part will have a 45% of the final mark of the work and the oral part will count 55% of that same mark.
